

# Palisades Episcopal School Lower School Overview

Palisades Episcopal School is seeking a creative, passionate, enthusiastic administrator with a lifelong love of learning to fill the role of Lower School Director. The Lower School at Palisades Episcopal School has a current enrollment of 197 students with 20 classroom teachers and teaching assistants. PES Lower School includes Junior Kindergarten through fourth grade programs with 2 classes per grade level. Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten classes have an optimal class size of 18 each, and first through fourth grade classes have an optimal class size of 20 each. The Lower School at Palisades Episcopal School provides a learning environment which cultivates a joyful love of learning through hands-on, engaging activities that teach children how to think, not what to think. A growing Social-Emotional Learning program, Responsive Classroom's morning meetings, devotions, Faith Studies, service projects and empathetic educators all contribute to students who respect differences, are growing in character daily, and develop a spirt of service for the community around them. The Core Knowledge curriculum provides a solid foundation of learning while creating opportunities to gain a broad range of knowledge as well as deep dives into topics of interest. Learning comes alive outside the classroom walls with outdoor learning and numerous field trips throughout the school year, averaging 1 per grade level per month. Community is fostered during weekly chapels, cross-grade level "buddies" and cross-divisional activities. Palisades Episcopal School seeks a dedicated educator with a strong desire for excellence and a commitment to inspiring a community of young learners to be curious, engaged and joyful to join the PES Lower School team.

- **Curriculum and Academics:** Ensure implementation of the Core Knowledge curriculum along with supplemental programming to build a solid foundation of knowledge and encourage a joyful love of learning
- **Community:** Build strong relationships with and amongst students, families and faculty and staff to create a culture of respect and belonging
- **Assessment/Data:** Model a portfolio of learning for individual students; coordinate pieces of portfolios, including quarterly report card reviews and assessments of MAP Growth (K-4) and ERB (3-8)
- **Service Learning:** Encourage an environment that promotes service and giving back to their community, beginning with our youngest learners
- **Faculty Growth and Observation:** Support faculty members by providing professional development opportunities and providing observations and feedback to further growth
